- 2. Approval of minutes from meeting on 1/12
 - Intel moves to approve minutes
 - o Netapp seconds
 - Minutes approved
- 3. Update on InterOp discussions
 - On-demand testing and eventual InterOp (SUSE/RedHat)
 - Adopter or above
 - Value add using OFA as co-ordinator
 - Consistency and independence of testing
 - Financial ?
 - o IWG has discussed with Suse testing IB/ROCE/iWARP
 - Suse has recently expressed interest in testing with IOL test suite
 - Stability test, alpha test, and interoperability test
 - Value for distro and hardware vendors to get early testing on OFED and upstream drivers
 - Early testing includes on-demand testing to evaluate feasibility
 - UNH estimate two weeks to get material onto provided machines
 - Approximately \$6K per week budget
 - Choices are to outsource work or perform work in house with UNH
 - Suse is open to working with IWG using OFA debug/Logo events
 - o The setup work is non-trivial to get to steady state testing

- Two distinct options: Distros participate in OFA interop and logo testing versus proposed on-demand testing directly with UNH/IOL
- Suse activities should not be seen as exclusively, Red Hat is also a likely participant
- This effort may create a draw for other vendors to participate in events
- Canonical (Ubuntu) is another good candidate
- Suse has demonstrated a commitment to OFA to conduct testing and provide guidance back to OFA and UNH/IOL
- Funding for IOL resulting from interop testing and logo events has been reduced to minimal levels due to inflation and budget reductions
- There are no extra budget resources to expand OS testing
- Benefits of proposed model versus Suse contracting directly with UNH/IOL include lower risk for vendors due to early mitigation of stability problems that effect customers
- Suse will be early adopter and wlll help benefit follow on customers due to establishment of automation and orchestration facilities using Ansible/Puppet/Chef
- Neither Red Hat nor Suse are OFA members today
- Expect data within a week from Suse
- Timeframe: Suse needs to start testing by end of April
- Board would need to make a decision about membership levels required for distro vendors, etc.
- SOW would be between Suse and OFA, and OFA would contract resources
- o Does it make sense to add a membership level
